

SUPPER ROCK NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES

SEPTEMBER 6, 2005

Jack Harris started the meeting at 7:07 p.m.

The minutes of the last annual meeting were reviewed and a motion was made to approve them and it was seconded.

Jack Harris read the Treasurer's report and gave the ending balance as \$2664.00

Amy, a police officer from Foothills Substation, gave a brief report about crime in the neighborhood. She mentioned that crime was up in some areas but they were not in the boundaries of SRNA. They were near Western Skies and off areas of Central. It was mentioned that the city has crime statistics on their website and the SRNA website has a link to it. She encouraged everyone to be the eyes and ears of the neighborhood and if you notice things that are suspicious call. She also mentioned that there have been no meth labs reported in the SRNA area.

The list of important phone calls for the city of Alb. was distributed. It was also announced that the 311 number is up and running.

Cards were distributed so that neighbors could ask questions of the candidates. Ken O'Keefe served as the moderator. Each candidate introduced themselves and were given equal time to respond to the questions.

The questions were as follows:

Will you attend annual meetings in the future?

How do you make the city council more non-partisan?

Are you in favor of eminent domain?

How well do you play with others?

What is your opinion about making Montano bridge 4 lanes?

How do you view working with the Mayor and the City Council?

Each candidate answered the questions.

Jim Williams, a reporter from KUNM 89.9 FM recorded this portion of the meeting.

Jason from the Zoning Dept. of the city answered questions. He gave the non-emergency number to get rid of old cars. That number is 768-CARS. He said the abandoned vehicles dept. should respond within 72 hours.

Jason indicated some animals are permitted to be kept within city residential areas. Chickens, doves are permissible. Raptors are not permitted. Cows are allowed until they are 6 mos. old.

He mentioned that there is a handbook which designates weeds that are considered harmful to people and animals.

He distributed a listing of agencies and services that neighbors may want to access.

He gave his phone number and encouraged calls. His number is 924-3856.

Don Coachmen of District 8 spoke briefly. He mentioned a coalition of Neighborhood Associations and that it costs \$15. a year to join.

Jack announced that Jude Baca was invited to the meeting and wasn't present at the meeting. There is nothing new to report about the South Pointe development project.

Jack thanked Mike Blackledge for doing such a fine job with the website.

It was recommended that we send a thank you note to Seth Heath for sending out the terrific postcards.

Jack mentioned that he was not running again for the Board. He opened it up for volunteers to serve on the Board.

Amy Harris, John Raess and Ken O'Keefe, and Ann Pedrone were mentioned as nominees.

There will be a meeting on October 11th to elect Board members.

Mike Blackledge thanked Jack and Cindy Harris for bringing the Board back to life.

Several people paid dues.

Meeting was adjourned.
